
Old saying: Wait until any possibility of an Indian Summer is over to plant tulip bulbs.

Please stay and help clean up if possible.


PLANT SALE REVIEW: 25th September 2017.

25th September Meeting recap.






A message from Margot.



The Vancouver Island Master Gardeners Association. Sunday, November 5th 2017.


