If there is lots of traffic, go past and up Village Way to turn round. <u>From QB</u>- The second driveway past Village Way with a big 1980 sign and a planter of

pansies on the mail box. Mine is the first house.

Please try to car-pool as parking is limited inside. You can park on the side of the road but if you come in and the parking is full, unload your stuff, then go to the end of the driveway and park in front of the white building. Please do not block the driveway.

Please bring as many plants as you can. We will go over all the plants - potting up those that need it - checking names etc. and pricing. Put as much info on the label as you can ie colour, height, shade requirement. We will have signs that say 'All plants need gritty, well drained soil unless otherwise stated'

We will also be doing cuttings so bring your choice of container - remembering that Paul Spriggs likes a bigger one that is not so inclined to dry out.

Bring sand or your choice of soil mix, rooting hormone, tweezers, sharp clippers, thin dibber for making a hole to slip cutting in, gloves. There is not much shade in June's garden yet so if it is hot, bring your hat. Please bring a **garden chair** and don't forget your **mug**.
