FOLLOW UP ON AGOFCVI EVENTS TRIP TO PARADISE MEADOWS TO SEE GENTIANS

This was a visit specially to see the King Gentian (Gentiana sceptrum), so on August 14th Barbara, Margot and I met Bernie in the Strathcona Park parking lot and went on our usual trip around the boardwalk. We almost immediately came upon the gentians, lots of them growing in the meadows with many of them wide open - or as wide open as they get!

We were very excited, as we have not been up in August before so had never seen them. We spotted them here and there, all the way around the trail and growing with them another new flower - Ladies Tresses (*Spiranthes romanzoffiana*), a very lovely orchid.
