#### **CALL TO ORDER**

The Annual General Meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm.

There were 20 members in attendance.

Acting Chairman, Vice President, Mike Miller, reviewed the Agenda and Rules of Order for conducting the Annual General Meeting and 2015/16 Elections.

Linda Derkatch moved and Dorothy Astridge seconded the motion to adopt the October 27, 2014 Minutes of the Alpine Gardeners of Central Vancouver Island as circulated.

#### **Financial Report**

The Year End Financial Report and Proposed 2016 Budget were circulated. (See attached) The Chair noted the following points relating to the report:

- Income is generally under-estimated.
- The Society has maintained a minimal profit and expenses have not exceeded income for 2014 and 2015-09-24.
- Contingency Fund is in place.
- 2015 statements reflect a breakdown of "plant sales" for 2014 versus "plant sales" and "plant sales at meetings" to reflect the difference in the entrance fee plus the plant draw ticket included in the \$5 entry.
- Affiliated Memberships include BC Council of Garden Clubs and Alpine Garden Club of BC (AGC-BC);
   membership in the provincial council is required to access liability insurance.
- Speaker costs include per diems/honorariums plus travel expenses relating to the speaker.
- Programme costs include speaker gifts and publicity costs e.g. poster printing.

Bev Young moved / Valerie Melanson seconded the motion to adopt the 2015 Financial Report as circulated.

#### **ELECTION**

Barb Lemoine was introduced to conduct the 2015/16 Election. It was reported that the term was for a 3 month period only in order to shift the AGCVI Year End to January. A further election will be conducted in January of 2016.

Four positions were mandatory: President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. The Chair noted that the only position currently required is for Vice-President. The current President (June Strandberg) and Vice President (Mike Miller) would remain until such time to fill these positions if nominations were not received.

Mike assured prospective volunteers for the Vice-President position that the duties are not onerous and that being V-P does not mean automatically becoming President. There are 10 executive meetings a year to attend but only one more general meeting before the January 2016 AGM. With this encouragement, Mary Taylor agreed to become interim Vice-President.
